Foreword by President

Our tenth season has just concluded, and in retrospect, I believe we have reason to be generally satisfied with our results and progress. Oatley's first Rugby game was played in April, 1958, by our only team - Under 12's - which included many younger age players. Two members of this original team are still playing with us in our Under 20 team - Geoff Tye and Lawrence Yeomans. I wonder how many present players will still be wearing Oatley's green jerseys in ten years from now? It is a tribute to the growth of Rugby in the St. George District and in Oatley in particular, that it is no longer necessary to play nine and ten years old boys in Under 12 teams, to give them a game.

There has been a vast improvement in the standard of Rugby through the years as a result of the dedication of our coaches and other officials and through the enthusiasm of our boys. The name "Oatley" is now known and respected in Rugby circles as far and wide as Brisbane, Hobart, Melbourne, Canberra, Wellington and Young, as well as in all areas of Sydney.

Once again, we finished second in the Club Championship, a competition embracing all teams and once again we equalled our record of having no less than eight of our twelve teams in the semi-finals and five in Grand Finals.

I extend my congratulations to the successful team and coaches, but my most sincere congratulations and thanks go to the players and officials of two of our teams, the Under 20's

and the Under 14's, who did not have the measure of success their efforts and training deserved, but they continued to train and play with enthusiasm throughout the season in spite of a number of resounding defeats. The thanks of this Club are particularly due to the coach of the Under 20 team, Mr. Monty Williams, and the youthful duo who coached and managed the Under 14 team, Bob Rankin and Laurie ("Smiley") Neville. The competition in these two age groups was of a particularly high standard, and it is to the credit of these two teams that they did not lose heart. The most hopeful feature of the 1967 season was the fact that we were able to field no less than two full Under 8 teams, both of which finished the year playing good Rugby in spite of the fact that some of the players can look forward to another season or possibly two in the Under 8 division. The coaches and managers of these two teams did a great job and I think we gained many ardent supporters among the new players' parents.

Total player registrations for the 1967 season were 235, which makes us a very big sporting organisation indeed, especially when it is considered that we have no sponsorship or backing whatever, as do many similar sporting bodies. Running a club of this size requires a lot of work and time from our officials. Some clubs hold regular fortnightly or monthly meetings through the season for officials or interested persons, but as some of our officers already spend three nights per month attending meetings of St. George & Southern Zone on behalf of the Club, plus one or more training sessions per week for individual teams, I feel that it would be asking too much of them to give up their time for even one more meeting per month. As most parents or supporters are asked to be present at only one meeting per year, I urge all families within the Club to be represented at our Annual General Meeting and election of office bearers which will be held in February 1968, and of which, notice will be given as the date approaches. Any suggestions or ideas for the benefit of the Club may be voiced at that meeting and volunteers for any official position will be most welcome. It is suggested that anyone prepared to act in any capacity notify the Secretary as soon as possible so that preliminary plans can be made for next season.

Many of us felt that we had suffered a severe setback when our previous Secretary, Mr. Ivan Jackson, announced at the beginning of the year that he would not be available for re-election

It was left to Mr. Ken Staples to fill the breach, albeit somewhat reluctantly, when no other volunteer came forward. He now realizes the heavy demands made by this important position, and although he was helped by Lawrence Yeomans (acting as internal registrar), Ray Benjamin as Assistant Secretary, and Mr. Noel Eccleston and his wife (who handled our finances), I believe that Ken will be hoping that Ivan will return to his former position next season. In addition to the officials mentioned above, Oatley owes a debt of thanks to Mr. Bob Hunter, one of our delegates to the St. George meetings, who merited high praise for his work on the "Draws Committee" this season. Bob is at present in Holland, but it is anticipated that he will be back in time for the next football season.

In addition to our own officials, we owe a very heavy debt of gratitude to St. George Junior officials, without whom our competition could not have been run. Foremost among them are the St. George Registrar, Mr. Ray O'Donnell, and his Assistant, Mr. Bruce Carr. They had to cope with no less than 1,653 registrations this season, and it is thanks to these two men that such strict standards of age registration apply in this Union. We are also indebted to Dr. John Perrot, President of the St. George Junior Referees, and his band of "whistle-blowers" for officiating at our games throughout the season for no other reward than an occasional word of appreciation and all too often, criticism and brickbats from the "side line referees".

Some parents have expressed a wish for more opportunities to mix socially with other parents and I believe that this is particularly desirable from point of view of parents of new players in the younger age groups. Those who feel strongly about this matter are invited to contact our Social Secretary, Mrs. Betty Sanders, to make suitable plans or to put forward ideas at our General Meeting. There will be an excellent opportunity for all teams and parents to get together at the PRESENTATION PICNIC at MENAI SPORTSGROUND on SUNDAY 24th SEPTEMBER and it is hoped that there will be 100% attendance. The trophies, representative pennants, premiership pockets and "100 match medallions" will be presented by the famous Wallaby forward Mr. Tony Miller, who has represented Australia in more Test Matches than any other player in Rugby history. More details of the picnic can be obtained from your Team Manager.

Lack of regular meetings admittedly causes a certain deficiency in communications within the Club, and I believe, that this could best be remedied by the publication of a fortnightly "News Sheet" to go to every family, and in which decisions made at the St. George meetings can be publicized, together with changes in match times and places, changes in laws, and interpretations, and items of general interest. We would greatly appreciate it if any parent or supporter who would be in a position to prepare and print (i.e. roneo) this "News Sheet" could contact the Secretary as soon as possible.

Insurance: After the 1967 Annual Meeting had been held an opportunity occurred to insure all our players for medical and dental expenses at a low 60¢ per player. The two senior teams were already seeking such insurance, but as it had not been discussed at a full meeting, your executive decided that for this season, it would be reasonable to charge all other players 40¢ and for the Club to subsidise the balance. Several parents have had good cause to be thankful that we did so, and to date, our compensations from the insurance company exceed our premium payments. However, as the majority of claims were for dental injury, I suggest that all parents would be well advised to investigate the purchase of a plastic mouthguard for their sons for the next season.

It would be expecting too much to hope that our growth continues at the same rate for our next ten years, but let us strive to continue the improvement in the standard of Rugby, for which Oatley has become known and respected.

THE INTERNATIONAL GAME

We thought it would be of interest, both to players and parents, to reprint an article appearing in the Victoria Rugby Union News -

" Rugby Union - the world's fastest growing sport! A big claim - but consider this list: England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, South Africa, New Zealand, Australia, France, Spain, Portugal, Italy, Rumania, East Germany, West Germany, Belgium, Holland, Poland, Czechoslovakia, Russia, Sweden, Bulgaria, Argentine, Brazil, Chile, Canada, U.S.A., Japan, Fiji, Tonga, Samoa, Ceylon, India, Malaya, Singapore, Rhodesia, Zambia, Thailand, Turkey, Denmark, East Africa.

All these countries have properly organised competitions and many of them play International fixtures. In addition Rugby is played on a more informal level in places like Hong Kong, Channel Islands, Bahamas, Switzerland.

The world's largest Rugby crowds have attended the France-Rumania matches in Bucharest - over 100,000 at a time.

In soccer conscious Russia the annual Moscow-Lenigrad intercity match draws 50,000 spectators.

The Crown Prince is patron of the Japanese Rugby Union and regularly attends club games.

Argentina had a highly successful first ever tour to South Africa in 1965, winning the majority of its games against provincial teams. The "Pumas" downed that South African Rugby citadel, Stellenbosch University and climaxed the tour with a magnificent win over the Junior Springboks.

Rumania, Poland, Czechoslovakia and East Germany play off each season for the Peace Cup - a competition inaugurated in 1957. India, Ceylon and Malaya enter teams each year in the All India Tournament.

The Canadian Rugby Union was properly constituted in May 1965; Combined Services (U.K.) toured there in 1964 and Scotland in 1966. British Columbia defeated the 1966 Lions 8 - 3. There are over 2,500 clubs in the British Isles. Pity the poor selectors!

Rugby is played in every Australian State including Tasmania. Counting school teams Victoria, Western Australia and South Australia have over 100 teams each. (There is no Rugby League in these States except for Western Australia).

The under 8 B team was established at the beginning of the competition to absorb the excess of both under 8 and under 9 players who had already played in trial games.

Throughout the season the number of players available each week was well in excess of one team, in fact as high as 23, but care was taken to ensure that each player was on the field for at least half of a game.

The season was very successful from the point of view of developing new players to Rugby Union, a fact pointed up by the transfer of four players to the under 8A and two players to the under 9 teams based on their performances, as the season developed. Most of these boys had not previously played.

Winney's father, died very suddenly only a few days later. Mr. Martyn Winney was the Manager of this team last season and he will be sincerely missed by us.
