Andrew Green and Chris Cole enjoyed their first season of rugby and, with two more seasons to go in the Under 7's, will certainly improve with this year's experience.



Well! What a difference a year makes.

With the success of 1989 behind us, Datley started their campaign to defend their title. Unfortunately, however, only two players from last year's 1st Grade and two players from the Premiership 3rd Grade sides were available and I, as the new coach, had challenges you couldn't jump over.

After receiving a great deal of help from the Committee and fellow players, and with phone bills hitting the roof, we started to take shape for the first round of the competition. A shortage of backs throughout the Club had the 1st Grade backline looking like a who's who of Datley pub on a Friday night. RICHARDSON REPORT


