## Juniors

1995 has been a season of continued strong growth in the junior ranks both in terms of player strength and most importantly, parent support and participation. The enthusiastic support among parents of all teams has been tremendous this year and it is no co-incidence that this season we have been the strongest Southern District club in mini rugby. I am confident that over the next few years this will flow fight through our junior teams and that in time we will be the strongest club in the area in terms of junior players.

On the playing field there were many highlights this season.

- \* Both the Under 6 and 9 mini teams were victors on Mini Gala Day with the under 8 team being beaten in extra time in the final. The under 9 team were undefeated against local teams all season and also won the Merrylands Carnival Day.
- \* Both the under 10 and 15 teams performed well in the Canberra 7's with the 15's reaching the final for the 4th year in a row.
- \* Chris Wing, Daniel Batman and Cade Sutherland were selected in the Sydney under 15 team which defeated Country in the annual representative match and Manu Sutherland was Coach.
- \* The under 9 team played an Exhibition game at the Sydney Football Stadium as a curtain raiser to the David Campese Testimonial Match.
- \* The Under 15 team was the only team to beat eventual Premiers Randwick. They just missed 2nd spot on the table after losing the last round in the final minutes and were unlucky to go into the minor semi the following week with injuries, illness and unavailability of key players.
- \* Pauliasi Taumoepeau was selected in both the under 9 and 10 Southern Districts representative teams. Congratulations to all players who made the representative teams this season.
- \* James Horne of the under 9's has now scored 134 tries in 70 games a remarkable effort.

The under 10's did very well in their first season of full field rugby after a tough early draw and will undoubtedly improve their position on the ladder in 1996. They have a lot of very promising rugby players and a very enthusiastic and committed coaching staff.

The under 11 's always did it hard for numbers on the paddock and performed very creditably under the circumstances. They have already recruited new players for next season and Wayne Lanham who has looked after these boys since their mini days is stepping down as coach to let the Club's Treasurer, Bill Bell, take over next year. This team will certainly be a big threat to other teams in their competition in 1996.

Nathan ROSE-Committed, elusive runner, good honest defence. Very good first year.


Andrew LATHAM- Mr Consistency -Great defender, good attack, improving organiser.




